## COVID 19 What's Going On Now?

Recently NBCF's Board of Directors appointed a special committee to keep the congregation informed of the latest data concerning COVID-19 and the impact on our church's safety guidelines and practices. The intent is to inform and maintain updates to the congregation every 1st Sunday including any pertinent, relevant, and necessary changes in our safety guidelines based on findings from the King County Department of Health, Washington Department of Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and World Health Organization (WHO).

Following is the report provided on the  $1^{\rm st}$  Sunday of July.

The Board of Directors have been focused on keeping our Sunday morning worship services as safe as possible by continuing our COVID-19 guidelines for church attendance. As we said last month we're learning to "Co-exist with COVID-19!" We're depending on everyone at NBCF to follow the safety measures prescribed by the CDC and state health organizations. We hope you're enjoying the pleasures of Summer. Students are out of school and joining in on the summer camp programs. We see lots of pictures of folks on vacation, out frolicking with friends/family members in the great outdoors and participating in large outdoor/ indoor gatherings and activities. While you're getting back into the swing of life, please remember all the things you need to do to keep yourselves COVID-19 safe. Like Nike's motto states, "Just do it!."

Since our presentation last month there's some good news. Vaccinations with Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna have proved safe and effective for children as young as 6 months old. COVID-19 vaccinations for all who are eligible to receive them are now more readily available through drug stores and some primary physicians' offices as well as some agencies that previously provided this service. Vaccinations are not difficult to schedule.

Let's look at the current facts for our area and compare these findings to our last report, provided on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday in June. As of Friday, July 1st in King County there were:

## Juneteenth Songs of Black Folk Music of Resistance and Hope

We were warned! Sunday after Sunday, leading up to the event, Pastor Braxton informed the congregation this event would be one for the history books, that it would be spectacular, that it would be amazing, that we did not want to miss it etc. My God was he right! If you were not in attendance, you missed the absolute best Juneteenth celebration in the state of Washington, and perhaps the entire country. Those attending the event were mesmerized by the soul stirring music presented by the orchestra, the choir, and the featured soloists. It was said that the ancestors would be in the midst and indeed they were. We are certain they were beaming with pride as the songs of their plight were rendered with precision. Mere words cannot sum up just how incredible the evening was. This is one event where you truly had to be there!

As noted in the program, we were invited to go with the conductor and performers on a musical journey, where we heard everything from Negro Spirituals to Gospel, from Jazz and Rhythm and Blues to Hip Hop and Spoken Word. All of these forms of music have functioned as a tool of resistance and a source of hope for a people who have endured four centuries of white supremacy and its unrelenting assault on their minds and bodies. It was the hope that the evenings music would connect the African American struggle for freedom and justice with the struggles of other Americans who have had to fight their way in from the margins of our society, seeking the American dream of America. Juneteenth is a day of freedom, and we still believe that We Shall Overcome Someday.

Thinking back to the days when Paul Robeson and Marion Anderson could not attend the theaters they were asked to sing at because of discrimination, it was Pastor's vision to have a Juneteenth celebration that would honor the day with a fine arts performance theme, focused on the songs of black folks. After speaking with Mayor Harrell and forming a partnership with One Seattle - Mayor Harrell's equity initiative - the vision was born. The hope is that this will become an annual event.





Let's pray that it does.

466,366 COVID-19 cases (an increase 29,242...or 10.6%)

12,581 hospitalizations (an increase of 500... or 10.4%)

2,897 deaths (increase of 75...or 10.3%)

In the state of Washington, as of June 30<sup>th</sup>, 9% of the hospital beds were occupied by COVID -19 patients.

If you're keeping track of the COVID-19 reports, then you know that the CDC Covid Community Levels have listed King County in the Medium level and Tacoma-Pierce County in the Medium-to-High level. We are still in the battle with COVID!

Many of us undoubtedly know of someone who has had COVID-19. So, you know it is real!! You also know that it is possible to have a recurrence of the virus. Right?! COVID-19 rebound has been reported between 2-to-8 days after initial recovery. Even Dr. Fauci had the virus and received Paxlovid (the drug which reduces the severity of the symptoms and keeps you out of the



hospital). He had a return of his symptoms after a week of recovery from his first episode! He said had he not been vaccinated he would not be alive to tell us about his experience. Vaccinations save lives!

Let us continue to stay safe using all the tools we have in the COVID-19 safety toolbox. We can coexist with COVID. Let's stay vigilant and still enjoy life, while remembering, what we can't do alone...We can do together!!

## For The Bible Tells Me So!

The AWANA program at New Beginnings has kept going strong throughout the pandemic with midweek online Bible study and activities for kids from kindergarten to 5<sup>th</sup> grade. AWANA stands for "Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed," and this year instead of a typical graduation celebration as the school year ended we started a new tradition: **For the Bible Tells Me So!** 

The brainchild of Commander Emeritus **Christina Humburgs**, this special May event was a special competition including a variety of team events. Clubbers had to work together on balloon relays and races to start off the festivities, and then got to line up and race for individual hidden prizes, but that was just to get warmed up!

Each team then got together for a lineup of high-speed Bible quizzing! They identified people and places from the Old and New Testament, completed Bible verses and spelling challenges, and answered true/false and multiple -choice questions about Bible history, events, and characters as well as verses and themes from our AWANA handbooks, with each AWANA leader creating a set of challenging questions for the clubbers.

After the team event, each clubber had the opportunity to come up and read Bible verses, gifts of the Spirit, books of the Bible, and more for solo bonus points, or memorize and recite them from memory for double bonus points. Short verses were worth a few points, while longer passages like Psalm 23 or the full books of the Bible were worth even more.

AND THE WINNER IS... Combining team and individual points, our first-ever champion was Ziel Allen, just edging out our two runners-up who tied for second place: Andrew Curtis and Zachary Heisen! While our top three got bonus awards, we had cash prizes for every single clubber, in addition to special graduation gifts for students who put in their time and study throughout the year!

#### Outreach Homeless and Feeding Ministry Update "For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat..."

The New Beginnings Outreach Homeless and Feeding Ministry is helping a lot of people in our region, which extends to the homeless population as well as those who need some extra groceries.

When we came to the church at the beginning of the year, our goal was to hopefully feed about 1,000 people per month. Our Pastor has, on many occasions, mentioned setting a goal that was too low. The goal of feeding 1,000 was obviously too low:

Our Tuesday feeding team provides 200-250 hot meals per month to individuals living unsheltered.

The Thursday senior meals team is providing 230-280 meals per month for seniors needing a meal.

The food pantry is providing groceries to families representing nearly 2,500 per month. We have recently begun providing food for a largely undocumented community and expect to feed nearly 150 persons per week.

We have begun providing cold cereal for the Renton Ecumenical Association of Church's, (REACH). This group provides breakfast to nearly 60 individuals every morning. Soon, we will be providing nearly 400 "heat and eat" meals every month for an agency in our neighborhood that's doing its part to end homelessness. Our primary food supplier (Food Lifeline) has provided nearly 100 tons of food for our feeding programs... at no cost to New Beginnings.

A year ago, we received a grant from the Renton Community Foundation in the amount of \$5000. Just last week, we received an unsolicited \$6,500 from them. We have even received money from our food supplier...God is so good!

Many thanks go out to those who have and continue to avail themselves to assisting in our feeding programs. Words cannot express how much your time and commitment to feeding the least of these is appreciated. However, we can always use additional hands. knew their purpose, as well as the Word of God they sang.

At one of our Psalmist Choir rehearsals his Scripture lesson came from 1 PETER 2:9 : "for you are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light." (NIV)

Rev. Sam reminded us that we are a chosen people, and that it was not by happenstance that we were ministering together.

As a royal priesthood, we have special rights and authority, as well as a responsibility to exhibit God's holiness. Every time we sing, dance, and praise, it is to reveal Christ to people who have never met Him--not so people see us but see the glory of God that shines through us. He went on to say that we are God's special possession -- God showers us with His grace, mercy, and forgiveness, and He dispatches His angels to watch over us. When we simply call on His name, demons tremble. When we touch and agree in His name, He will do what we ask. We must be careful with this special possession—our ministry—and make sure that we use our words carefully to speak life versus death.

Rev. Sam's impact and contributions to NBCF have been undeniable. He proved himself to not only be a talented director, teaching effective song selection and vocal technique to advance the sound of each music ministry, but a man grounded in the Word of God, preaching the Gospel at rehearsals and from the pulpit, along with his father on NBCF's "Townsend Takeover Sunday." He beseeched ministry members to truly understand the scriptural references and the meaning behind the songs they sing, to exude that understanding to the congregation.

#### Dr. Joycelyn Thomas Receives Distinguished Alumni Award From UW School Of Nursing

NBCF, let's join in celebrating and congratulating our own Dr. Joycelyn Thomas for receiving this distinguished honor. Not only does Joycelyn prove her commitment to health and well being in the broader community, she also plays a key role in bringing awareness to men and women's health issues within her NBCF family. As the leader of NBCF's Health and Wellness Ministry, Joycelyn has orchestrated onsite mobile mammograms, she's brought in health experts in the fields of Breast Cancer, Prostate Cancer and other health concerns. Joycelyn has also been the catalyst for the partnership with AARTH in NBCF hosting vaccine clinics, not to mention the work she did in getting onsite COVID testing when the pandemic was at its peek. We thank our Sister, Dr. Joycelyn for her unyielding dedication and commitment to the health and wellbeing of those in the Seattle community and most of all to those in her church family. Let us pray God's continued blessings on her calling/ministry.

Following is a copy of an article - written by Aaron Allen, - that appeared in the Seattle Medium Newspaper highlighting Joycelyn's accomplishment.

To celebrate National Nurses Month the University of Washington School of Nursing announced Dr. Joycelyn Thomas, President of the Mary Mahoney Professional Nurses Organization (MMPNO) - a professional organization of Black nurses in Seattle, as the recipient of its Distinguished Alumni Award and one of its Nurses of Influence.

The award honors and recognizes a graduate whose career in nursing exemplifies excellence in leadership in a professional organization, contributions to the community, excellence in clinical practice and outstanding accomplishments.

Dr. Thomas received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree in 1996, Master's in Nursing degree in 2013, and Doctor of Nursing Practice in 2014; all at the University of Washington School of Nursing. Reflecting on why she chose nursing as a career, she said, "That passion or drive to help people never went away as I grew older. I had a menagerie of little wild and domestic animals and tended to each one like they were a child. That was my goal in life, to be in health care. I fashioned school and activities around this."

As an alumnus of the University of Washington School of



Nursing, Thomas continues her spirit and commitment to the school. One way Thomas accomplishes this goal is serving as a clinical preceptor, an experienced practitioner who provides supervision during clinical practice and facilities the application of theory for students and staff learners. By doing this Thomas is paying it forward to succeeding generations of nursing students. She also gives homage to all women, Black women and women of color for the contributions they provide to make this world better.

To be seen by my community is amazing," says Thomas of the award. "There are so many Black women, women of color, women in general doing things that are just amazing, you can't even imagine some of things these women are doing in the world today to move things forward in this world. To make a change, to make a difference. For me, I just feel for a lack of better word, I feel honored, but truly it's humbling and exhilarating at the same time."

One of the major accomplishments Thomas and her fellow members of MMPNO achieved during the pandemic was orchestrating the vaccinations of thousands of citizens during the pandemic. MMPNO's collaborations resulted in delivery of over 8,000 vaccinations working with Southeast Seattle Senior Center, New Beginnings Christian Church, Dunia Clinic, Center for Multicultural Health, City of Seattle, Fred Hutch, Seattle Cancer Care Alliance and African American Reach and Teach organizations. "The pandemic along with the social justice movement in the wake of the killing of George Floyd spurred me to action," says Thomas. "I felt energy I have not felt in years to get something done. I invested my efforts in collaborating with others, to administer vaccinations in underserved communities. It was amazing."

In addition to providing vaccinations, MMPNO awarded fourteen nursing students of African descent scholarships this year. s. It was amazing."

While Thomas is happy about her recognition, her goal is to lead by example and be an influencer and an inspiration to others.

"This honor is not for me, this honor is for my community because it highlights the work, I wouldn't have gotten this honor if I wasn't doing the work with my community," Thomas says. "I want to be an example, a resource, an inspiration. I feel that if I can be the best at what I believe in, then others will mimic or follow."

### Pastor Braxton Celebrates 40 Years in Ministry!

Can you believe it? Yes, Pastor Braxton has been in ministry for 40 Years! He would probably say, "I know I don't look old enough to have been in ministry for 40 Years." Nevertheless, it's true. It was July 4, 1982, when he was licensed to preach by his Pastor Floyd D. Bullock at Bethlehem Baptist Church in Tacoma. On that day, Pastor was
