Should We Only Listen to the Bible for Guidance?

hile the Bible does provide good insight into navigating the complications of life, it is not the sole source for our guidance. Yes, we should read and absorb what the Bible says, but we must be careful to not just relying on our own reading and interpretations for guidance. Doing so can potentially lead to taking Scripture out of context, which can create confusion, making haphazard life decisions and operating from a pretext. Thus, in addition to reading and "listening" to what the Bible says, it's equally important that we participate in church service and bible study classes where we can learn how to not only interpret Scripture but gain a better understanding of what the text says. As life-long learners, we must be open to availing ourselves to the wise counsel of those who have spent time and money studying the Bible, which includes how to interpret and apply the text to everyday life experiences.

The church also bears a great responsibility in our interpretation and application of Scripture. This includes ensuring there are bible study classes, small group sessions, relevant and timely ministry programs and biblically sound preaching that enhances our understanding of God's Word. Aligning ourselves with other Christians,

enduring and sharing some of the same struggles is also key to our understanding and interpretation of Scripture. It's often said that experience is the best teacher; where best than the church - among a community of believers - to witness how God has blessed others through not only his Word but how others interpret and internalize it. Further, when we interpret Scripture we bring to it our life expe-

riences and cultural traditions, which can affect our ability to interpret and apply what's being read. While life may be complicated, interpretation of Scripture can be equally complicated and requires thoughtful attention. In the sense that we must be willing to wrestle with Scripture and not be afraid to question what it says, not afraid to have a conversation directly with God about our assumptions, confusions and inability to understand. Questioning the Bible helps in our understanding and shapes our interpretation of what the author is trying to convey

NBCF Hosts Evergreen Association's MLK Day Service


This year's program was nothing less than amazing! From start to finish, participants were inspired on many levels. The Evergreen Mass Choir, under the direction of NBCF's own Rev. Sam Townsend, featuring soloist, Lady Kenisha Blackman was nothing less than spectacular. Keeping in line with the theme, "Restoring the Pursuit of a More Perfect Union," each individual that spoke reminded the audience to pursue justice, love one another and conquer hate via love. The keynote speaker for the evening, Rev. Dr. Marvin McMickle, stirred the pot even more as he challenged the audience on many levels. While we couldn't capture everything he said, we did get the jest of it. Following is a (paraphrased) snippet of his message, "Be a Witness," from Acts 1:6-8.

The audience was challenged to know the difference between Justice and "Just-us" and to ensure we make Justice for all people. Further, we are to be a witness for the Lord, which involves, 1) seeing something; paying attention to what's going on around us...2) saying something about what we've seen. As he noted, this is where most of us fall away....by not saying anything - if you see it, you ought to say something...3) the Greek word for witness is martyria...Jesus says if you see something and say something, you must be prepared to suffer something - being a tireless person for Justice requires sacrifice, suffering and struggle...if you don't want to lose anything, you won't gain much - Jesus is asking us to be a martyria for the cause of Justice - that's why Martin Luther King died - silence is not the way to fight the devil - someone has to speak...wherever church folk don't want to go, (be it Judea, Samaria, or to the ends of the earth) that's



where God will send us - he stretches us and causes us to get out of our comfort zones...it's good for us to be together on MLK Day, among like minded Christians, but will we love Martin as much the day after the celebration? Dr. McMickle noted he took a peak in God's hymn book and could not find "God Bless America" anywhere...but, what is in God's hymn book is, "God's got the whole World in his hands"...Our charge is to be God's witness no matter where he sends us, be it our home town or other parts of the world; and as we go, we should sing God's favorite song.

Thank you one and all for your attendance and let us all be mindful that we are called to be a witness for Jesus, not just on MLK Day but everyday.

so that we may properly apply the Word to our individual lives and circumstances.

Listen to the Bible yes, but part of listening involves talking back to it, raising key questions and paying attention (listening) to God for answers. We must sit still long enough for God to speak to our hearts and answer those questions we raise. If we are going to "listen" to what the Bible says, we must be willing to relinquish our preconceived notions about what we think it says and any preconceived notions that everything in the Bible is to be taken literally, which is not the case. This is where personal devotion becomes paramount to our interpretation and understanding of Scripture. This is the time to sit in stillness to commune with God. It's in our personal devotional time where we can truly wrestle with the text and raise questions such as, how is this text applicable to my life? God, what message are you trying to convey through this text? Or, how can this text give me the strength I need to carry on? Whatever we are wrestling with in relation to the Word can and should be addressed directly with God in the quietness of communing with him one-on-one.

Lastly, if we only listen to what the Bible says, we are likely to miss-interpret the Scriptures, which will only lead to an even further complicated, confusing journey on the road to life. Listening to only what the Bible says can potentially have you all messed up not knowing who or what to believe. Therefore, we must be open to wise counsel and one key Scripture that reminds us of this is Proverbs 4:7, which tells us, "Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore, get wisdom: and with all your getting get understanding." Everyone sees, hears and interprets things differently. We all have our own biases and it's good to discuss and share those differences with other Christians, which in turn helps in our gaining a better understanding of God's Word.

After a long and varied career with the US Customs Service/Customs and Border Protection, Pamela retired on Friday February 2, 2019. Pamela started her career January 15, 1980 as a student trainee, Import Specialist in Buffalo, NY. While employed, she worked as a "summer" inspector and sought a Bachelor's degree in Political Science at Buffalo State College. Upon graduation, Pamela became a fulltime Customs Inspector in January of 1982. She has served as a Customs Inspector, Supervisory Inspector, Chief Customs Inspector and Chief Customs and Border Protection Officer, after 9-11. She worked several detail assignments in Los Angeles, the Bahamas and Vancouver, Canada. She worked the land border at Buffalo/ Niagara Falls, Chicago, and two tours, for a total of ten years, under the auspices of the U.S. State Department in Toronto, Canada. Pamela relocated to Seattle in April of 2000, as a new supervisor, for what was thought to be a 2 - 3 years assignment, but God obviously had different plans. In 2008, after 26 years as a Federal Officer, Pamela left the uniformed position for a civilian position with the agency, to care for her elderly grandmother. As a civilian Pamela has held the positions of Supervisory Mission Support Specialist, Law Enforcement Explorer coordinator and Program Manager.



In June 1982, he applied for the position of first-line supervisor and was promoted in March 1983, working as a service supervisor. In December 1984 Frank qualified as a transit coordinator on the old voice radio system in the Exchange Building. He has been part of three major radio upgrade projects. In April 1990, Frank qualified in the Training Unit and was a part of the Tunnel Training Project, Breda Training Project, and the Waterfront Street

Car, as well as being a classroom instructor for part-time transit operators. He also participated with a group of employees to restore retired transit coaches, in the Metro Employees' Historical Vehicle Association.

He says he will always remember the Seahawks' Victory Parade, WTO, Husky football and the far too many construction projects impacting our service area.

Frank will miss all of the people he has worked with, including his colleagues in Vehicle Maintenance, Power & Facilities, and all of the police and fire departments and local utilities.

Finally, he will miss the early morning commute from Lake City to the Transit Control Center. Early mornings are so beautiful.

His last day on duty will be Friday, January 11th.


