
Celebrate Recovery

In the last two years of the Celebrate Recovery Ministry, lives have changed in the healing of broken spirits, learning to trust and love again and success in managing and controlling anger. These successes come from those who are sick and tired of being sick and tired, while doing the work to heal. We all struggle with our hurts, habits or hang-ups in varying degrees of discomfort or concern. Some may know what's at the root of their hurts, habits or hang-ups, while others may not be aware of them or have suppressed theirs. In Romans 7:15-17 we hear the words of Paul, "I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me." Whatever our case, we can all pray this prayer,

> God, Grant me the Serenity to accept the people I cannot change, Courage to change the one I can and the Wisdom to know that one, is Me.

The Celebrate Recovery Program was developed by John Baker at the Saddleback Church of Rick Warren, Pastor and author of "The Purpose Driven Life." This ministry is based on the 12 Step program of Alcohol Anonymous and include 8 principles derived from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, the "Beatitudes." Our higher power is, "Jesus!" The leaders themselves are people who also have hurts, habits and hang-ups and have worked the 12 Step and 8 Principal programs. We take seriously guarding everyone's privacy and confidentiality, in all cases and at all times.

This Ministry addresses more than substance-abuse and alcoholism; following are some examples of other hurts, habits and hang-ups we give attention to.





Dotcy's Perspective

As a leader at T-Mobile, one of the functions that reports to Dotcy is Diversity and Inclusion. As such, he occasionally provides perspective on topics related to diversity and inclusion. Dotcy was recently interviewed for an article on Dr. Martin Luther King, which was published on T-Mobile's intranet. He would now like to share that information with us.

While segregation tends to be associated with the U.S. South, Dr. King spoke about Chicago being one of the most challenging cities during the civil rights struggle in the 20th century.

Too young to remember much of the life of Dr. King, Dotcy does clearly remember being in school when the civil rights leader was assassinated in 1968, and the strong sense of loss and fear felt in the African American community following King's death. Dotcy also remembers the pride of some contrasted with protests by others when Chicago renamed a street in King's honor shortly after.

While Dotcy has been inspired by many of King's writings, he was particularly taken with Why We Can't Wait, a book written by King that traces the civil rights movement through 1963. Like many others, Dotcy was struck by King's visionary approach and deep thinking.

Being influenced by Indian activist Mahatma Gandhi, King led the U.S. civil rights movement through nonviolent protest, which included tactics civil disobedience – disobeying laws that were morally unjust. King recognized that changing laws was not enough, and that African-Americans also needed equal access to jobs, pay equity, and access to education, employment and medicine. King championed socio-economic justice, realizing that a lack of access to opportunity leads to

cultural and societal issues that compound over the course of generations. And while there have been great strides in the past 50 years, there is much more work left to do to address these issues.

Working for equality and inclusion is not just about what happens in our communities – it's also about what happens in our



workplace. As T-Mobile's EVP of Human Resources Liz McAuliffe announced last year, a new immersive experience, Insight Out, is being rolled out across T-Mobile to open dialogue about unconscious bias, and help us create a more inclusive environment for everyone on #TeamMagenta.

Dotcy says it's important for all of us to understand and give voice to the stories of history – of King's and others' fight for equality – to ensure that their passion lives on.

Dotcy encouraged everyone to consider honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr this year – and every year - by participating in a Day of Service, with either their local D&I chapter or volunteering in their community. If you aren't able to participate in an event, take some time to learn more about the civil rights movement and King by reading his writings, such as Why We Can't Wait. By understanding our country's civil rights history, we can preserve King's teachings and in doing so fight against injustice and fight for equality.

A Street Named Lesesne

Lesesne St.reet in Kissimmee Florida was named to honor the late William "Buster" Lesesne, father of NBCF's own Carl Lesesne, and Grandfather of Carlette Morrow and Shari Cal.

Mr. Lesesne earned this honor through his community activism, and fighting against segregation and discrimination. He also helped and supported people in his community who were trying to start a business. In 1983 after 45 years of service in the Kissimmee area, Buster Lesesne of Buster Cab Service retired. Buster Cab was the only cab service for African Americans in Kissimmee. He had the only black owned cab service in KIssimmee. He was highly respected in the local government. In the 1950's Buster had then minor leaguer, Hank Aaron stay at his house and would take him to the minor league ball park on Sumner Street. A lifelong Democrat, Buster had been involved in local politics, serving on various committees to former Governor Askew. He also had a front row seat to Governor Bob Graham's inauguration.

We thank the Lesesne family for sharing this bit of history with us.



Investment Vehicles for Financial Legacy - Presenter, Dennis Williams Jr.

In this session we learned the definitions for...

Primary investment vehicles such as retirement (401K/IRA) and non retirement (individual/joint/brokerage/529) accounts.

Common investment instruments or asset classes, such as CD's Bonds, Stocks, Mutual Funds, Real Estate and annuities. How to utilize them all to diversify and reduce risk. Also, how they are important but each more so at certain times. For instance, stocks are associated with a growth focus and bonds and real estate may be associated with income. These assets are what fuel the above investment vehicles.

Methods of protecting the above vehicles and assets; updating beneficiaries (for qualified or retirement accounts) and transfer on death (for non retirement accounts like banking or brokerage accounts) information, utilizing revocable living trusts to streamline asset transfer upon death and avoid probate, having an updated will and pour over will to include thing not in trust, having adequate insurance



coverage (term / whole / long term care insurance) to protect you so that the assets you've worked so hard for aren't depleted due to the unexpected.

Legacy planning is essential. We must utilize tools to transfer assets efficiently and impactfully. We must protect our assets as stated above while being mindful of the various tools available that will allow the owner to benefit from the assets and income while living...while at the same time designating entities like NBCF as a beneficiary upon death. Another valuable tool is is the Irrevocable Life Insurance Trust or ILIT which allows you to gift money to the trust which will then purchase life insurance policies where the proceeds will go directly to beneficiaries upon death. The ILIT can be used to pass on tax free money, pay

estate taxes, and magnify the financial impact we aim to have on generations to come. There is no limit to the number of insurance policies one can have, which can also be listed in the form of a trust.

Whew, if your head is spinning from this summary, we strongly encourage you to view the You Tube videos, write down your questions and consult a professional for further guidance. Many thanks to each of the presenters for taking time out of their busy schedules to enlighten us about our financial affairs.
