

For Everything There is Season: On this Christian Journey

For everything there is a season. It was approximately 11 years ago when I was asked to serve as the interim Children's Choir Director. My response was the familiar "Who me Lord, Really? I don't think so. As I was not seeking the role as the choir director, the thought never crossed by mind. However, I was raised in church and learned the importance of serving in the church community and serving others. By nature, I am an introvert, behind the scenes is where I find comfort and this role would require me to step out of the box. It was much after contemplation, prayer, nudging and the prompting of the Holy Spirit that I accepted the assignment.

I began the journey with uncertainty, fear and narrow-minded thinking. My worst night-mare was I would raise my hands to direct the children and nothing would come out of their mouths. I had never taught a song or led a rehearsal in my life! However, being the

beneficiary of many great choir directors, I tapped into my experiences and what I had seen over the years and applied it. Through this experience, which I never took lightly, I have grown spiritually and was reminded of many lessons, which include:

- ☐ God's will be done and not mine
- ☐ Sometimes you must step out of the box to receive the blessings God has for you
- ☐ Your faithfulness will be rewarded
- ☐ In all things, depend on the Holy Spirit for guidance
- Don't miss your blessings because you only see your limitations and fail to see God's accommodations in the work he has planned for you.

It has been an honor to sow the word of God through song into the spirits of the children. And I will continue to do so in different ways. I'm encouraged when I hear the parents tell me their children will not stop singing a certain song. One of my favorite stories is when a church school teacher shared with me that they were discussing their lesson and it aligned with a song the children were learning and they all broke out in song. That is a wonderful example where the fruit was revealed. I count it as joy, a privilege and a blessing to have served as the Voices of Angels Children's Choir director for so many years and conclude this chapter as "Mother Adriene." I would like to thank my church family for the many prayers, words of encouragement, support and love shown along the way.


















Keynote Speaker

Dr. Herman J. Felton Jr. is the 17th President and CEO of Wiley College. Dr. Felton began his service to the College in the summer of 2018, and has, in a short period of time, achieved significant accomplishments there. Dr. Felton was previously at Wilberforce University in Wilberforce, Ohio, where he served as the school's 21st president.

Dr. Felton earned his bachelor's degree in political science from Edward Waters College in Jacksonville, Florida. Also, he earned his Juris Doctorate from the Levin College of Law at the University of Florida and completed graduate work at Jackson State University, where he earned the Doctor of Philosophy in Educational Administration and Supervision.

Wiley College, founded in 1873 in Marshall, Texas, is one of the oldest historically black colleges. The school is most widely known for its famed Debate Team of the 1930s portrayed in the 2007 movie "The Great Debaters" starring Denzel Washington.

Now that she has attended the forum, she is sharing highlights of her experience. See below. From the looks of it, Amber was part of something that will lay a good foundation for her pursuits in the medical field. Congratulations to you Amber and may God continue to bless you in the days and years ahead.

Being invited and having the opportunity to participate in The Congress of Future Medical Leaders and Envision's National Youth Leadership Forum: Medicine was like a dream come true. Ever since I was 6 or 7-years-old, I'd always fantasize about becoming a doctor so that I could assist those in need. Having the chance to partake in both programs not only has helped me get on the right track to success, but it has also given me an advantage in experiencing what the medical field is like and the roles a doctor has.

During my time spent at both programs, I've learned that going into a profession such as medicine will take time and commitment and I need to remain patient with myself and trust the process. I also need to take into consideration now while I am still in high school, who I'm letting into my "friend" circle, "Will they make my vision come true?" "Are they encouraging me and what I want to pursue in life?" "Are they here to bring me down rather than uplift me?" I also need to learn to brush off my mistakes and laugh a little at myself to balance my mind and body. To





piggy back off of that, learning to put myself first sometimes is very important. Through hands-on activities, I've learned how to perform phlebotomy, assist someone who is injured or is suffering from hypothermia or hyperthermia. I know how to check someone's airway by using the ABC method. I've learned how to properly apply a tourniquet/splint and check Blood Pressure levels. I've also been taught how to write a resume.


Going forward, pursuing such a competitive field as cardiac and thoracic surgery, I know I must stay focused on my school work so that I may get to that point, shadow doctors and ask for advice and letters of recommendation, and also gain that mentee/mentor relationship with that doctor. I would definitely continue to pursue medicine after high school to become the Cardiovascular/ Cardiothoracic Surgeon (is what some people call it) I know I can be through hard work and dedication.










