# **NBCF Opens Its Doors to Vaccinations**

In collaboration between Fred Hutch Cancer Research Center (FH), Seattle Cancer Care Alliance (SCCA), African American Reach and Teach Health (AARTH) and New Beginning Christian Fellowship, we administered the first vaccination effort 2/20/2021 @ NBCF. To date we have given over 1200 first doses! In response to the Covid 19 pandemic and in effort to decrease the impact of COVID 19 on the African and African American communities, several health organizations are partnering with community organizations to get vaccine into the arms of Black Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) communities. Health organizations are securing vaccine from their supplies to specifically direct and or target these marginalized groups.

African Americans are affected by COVID 19 at a disparate rate, are hospitalized due to COVID 19 and die from COVID 19 at the highest rate than their white counterparts. There are many factors that impact these numbers but the heart of it is the impact of racism, white supremacy, and anti blackness. Due to these factors African Americans traditionally do not trust science and the medical field and have limited access to correct and accurate information regarding COVID 19 disease and vaccination efforts.

Additionally, the impact of racism has affected our immune response and puts us at higher risk for severe disease due to inflammatory conditions that plague our com-munities such as hypertension, hyper-lipidemia, and diabetes.

AARTH and Fred Hutch have a relationship with regards to HIV and AIDS education in the brown and black communities. Through conversation it was determined

an alliance was to be formed in order to bring vaccination to our community. Since I am on the board of AARTH they reached out to me to brainstorm about the idea and where it could be held. A few phone calls later and a dozen text messages the collaborative was born. We started with one date and now are planned to provide at least 4 first dose clinics each month through

The outpouring from our Pastor and church leadership and staff has been amazing. We could not have done it without the collaboration of our church.

NBCF and close networks and now has blossomed to the greater Seattle area, come one come all. The volunteers are eager and willing to serve. Participants coming to get vaccinated have made phone calls, left emails and text messages about how grateful they are to have received the vaccine.

I think what is unique to our clinic is that our volunteer base of medical professionals are of the African American community. Some participants had tears in their eyes when they arrived as they realized they were being served by professionals and experts that looked like them. That alone has been truly special. Additionally, non licensed personnel is primarily from NBCF initially, and that core group has continued to show up and show out. Greeters, Ushers and Deacons. Data entry is supported as well by several NBCF members and let me tell you, they have been wonderful. Data entry folks let us know "do not put us in a room, we want to be where the people are!" We also have a member who is a pharmacy tech who leaves her full time job to come down after work during the week and on the weekends.

People feel welcome when they come in and are greeted by kind, loving and warm individuals. The service has been incredible.

I give a pep talk during clinic and remind our volunteers how important it is to be in a celebratory mood as this is the first time many folks have had any medical attention all. Participants have worked through their fears to walk through our doors and get vaccinated to protect themselves and their loved ones. It has been awe



inspiring to say the least.

There are too many names to mention. However, I would be remiss if I did not say this would not have happened without the vision and commitment to this effort by our pastor Dr. Leslie D. Braxton, Clarence Williams, Kevin Meeks, Keith, FH/SCCAA, and AARTH.



# Welcome Back, Welcome Back!



# 2.23.21 MWA Live with Zhane Condly-Perez, Youth and Young Adult Music Director

Zhane led a highly interactive MWA Live session, When Words Fail, Music Speaks. She shared that we



want folks to leave worship services with hope, conviction, redemption, and encouragement. Zhane added that we must be in tune with our minds, and our hearts as well. What thoughts are being provoked? How do we make

sure the message is getting across to the congregation?

Zhane the proceeded to take the group through thought provoking, engaging activities where they selected a song on the topic of Perseverance as a Song of Preparation for a Mass Choir of 60+ voices. She then asked the group to engage in an activity where they broke into small groups to select a song on the topic of Love as a Prayer Response for an Ensemble of 12 voices maximum. For an Ensemble, you typically select songs that would not be used for a Mass Choir. Some of the songs selected included Love Lifted Me, Love Medley, More Than Anything and He Loves Me. The final exercise was to select a Praise song on the topic of Joy for a Youth Choir, like NuGenesis, with members in the 6th-11th grades. Joy can be synonymous with many things. Know the definition of the word. The song doesn't have to have the Bless the Lord word in the title or the lyrics but should exemplify joy. Some of the songs selected by the groups included Trading My Sorrows, Everybody Clap Your Hands, This is the Day and Bless the Lord.

Zhane shared this Scripture - 1 Corinthians 14:15 (NIV) - So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding.

# 3.9.21 MWA Live with Brother Nathaniel Patterson, NBCF Keyboardist

Nat led us through a wonderful, thought-provoking MWA Live session. He started by letting us know that growing up as a little kid, at the age of 8, he sat down at the piano in his mother's basement. He didn't know what he was doing--he just started playing the keys.

As he got older, he began to figure things out. Nat shared that he had to be beaten to sleep at night because he would get up at 2:00 am and go downstairs to practice and try to figure something out on the piano. His mother would say, "Boy, what are you doing? You have to go to school in the morning. Go to bed!" He'd go to bed for a little while, and then head back down to the basement a few minutes later. His mother figured out that he truly wanted to play the piano, and encouraged him to take lessons, however, he didn't want to take them. As he got older, he said he wishes he would have listened to his mother. He doesn't know where he would be had he listened.

Nat would, however, learn from some of the great musicians in this area: Curley Fisher, Jimmy Brown, and Isaac Johnson. He started listening to them and others, and things came naturally. He thanked God that he had a little bit of ability. He doesn't claim to be great, but he can hold his own!

Nat shared that he thinks our Music Department is

# Women's Ensemble - Women's History Month/Palm Sunday



# Tax Day for individuals extended to May 17: Treasury, IRS extend filing and payment

The Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service announced today that the federal income tax filing due date for individuals for the 2020 tax year will be automatically extended from April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021. The IRS will be providing formal guidance in the coming days.

"This continues to be a tough time for many people, and the IRS wants to continue to do everything possible to help taxpayers navigate the unusual circumstances related to the pandemic, while also working on important tax administration responsibilities," said IRS Commissioner Chuck Rettig. "Even with the new deadline, we urge taxpayers to consider filing as soon as possible, especially those who are owed refunds. Filing electronically with direct deposit is the quickest way to get refunds, and it can help some taxpayers more quickly receive any remaining stimulus payments they may be entitled to."

Individual taxpayers can also postpone federal income tax payments for the 2020 tax year due on April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021, without penalties and interest, regardless of the amount owed. This postponement applies to individual taxpayers, including individuals who pay self-employment tax. Penalties, interest and additions to tax will begin to accrue on any remaining unpaid balances as of May 17, 2021. Individual taxpayers will automatically avoid interest and penalties on the taxes paid by May 17.

Individual taxpayers do not need to file any forms or call the IRS to qualify for this automatic federal tax filing and payment relief. Individual taxpayers who need additional time to file beyond the May 17 deadline can request a filing extension until Oct. 15 by filing Form 4868 through their tax professional, tax software or using the Free File link on IRS.gov. Filing Form 4868 gives taxpayers until October 15 to file their 2020 tax return but does not grant an extension of time to pay taxes due. Taxpayers should pay their federal income





tax due by May 17, 2021, to avoid interest and penalties.

The IRS urges taxpayers who are due a refund to file as soon as possible. Most tax refunds associated with efiled returns are issued within 21 days.

This relief does not apply to estimated tax payments that are due on April 15, 2021. These payments are still due on April 15. Taxes must be paid as taxpayers earn or receive income during the year, either through withholding or estimated tax payments. In general, estimated tax payments are made quarterly to the IRS by people whose income isn't subject to income tax withholding, including self-employment income, interest, dividends, alimony or rental income. Most taxpayers automatically have their taxes withheld from their paychecks and submitted to the IRS by their employer.

### State tax returns

The federal tax filing deadline postponement to May 17, 2021, only applies to individual federal income returns and tax (including tax on self-employment income) payments otherwise due April 15, 2021, not state tax payments or deposits or payments of any other type of federal tax. Taxpayers also will need to file income tax returns in 42 states plus the District of Columbia. State filing and payment deadlines vary and are not always the same as the federal filing deadline. The IRS urges taxpayers to check with their state tax agencies for those details.

# Winter storm disaster relief for Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas

Earlier this year, following the disaster declarations issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the IRS announced relief for victims of the February winter storms in Texas, Oklahoma and Louisiana. These states have until June 15, 2021, to file various individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. This extension to May 17 does not affect the June deadline.

# When I Was Hungry...You Fed Me

The Outreach Ministry continues to provide nutritious meals and food supplies to those experiencing food shortages.

We feed nearly 100 homeless individuals every first Saturday. Most recently, we served pulled corned beef brisket along with the fixings to our guests at Renton REACH.

On Thursday nights we prepare 40-50 meals for seniors and shoes challenged to cook for themselves.

Currently we are preparing about 300 meals per month.

We are also able to provide groceries for folks in need. We are preparing and distributing 30-40 bags per week for distribution.

Were were recently awarded a \$5,000 grant, renewable monthly, to increase our meal and food production/ distribution.

Following is a snippet of the letter received from Renton Regional Community Foundation that honored us with the award.

We are so grateful to God for the bounty he has supplied us with, which will greatly enhance our service to the "least of these." Please keep the ministry in prayer as we continue to walk in Matthew 25:35, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in,"


thought provoking and spirit enriching topics such as Faith Over Fear, Advent, Politics and the Bible, and Lent and Black History.



all over the world that are submitted to us by telephone and the internet.



This has been by far the best church fellowship we have ever grown through. We love NBCF and know you love us as well. You will never be replaced but always remembered.


