The highlight of the evening was by far the play "*I Hope*, *I Am*," an original play inspired by the life of Adelaide Hall, written by NBCF member Kelly Keating. The entire production was presented by NBCF's Music and Worship Arts Ministry.

Adelaide Hall was a singer with the Duke Ellington Orchestra during the Harlem Renaissance. She came from a religious family that didn't want her to pursue a career in entertainment. However, determined to follow her dreams, Adelaide went against her families wishes and pursued her dream to become a star rivaling Josephine Baker. She is also noted for being one of the first to introduce vocal scatting to the music world. Adelaide died in 1993 at the age of 92.

The play was based on her story. It took place in modern day with a young lady, Adelaide, who had the same desire and a mother who acknowledged her talent but didn't want to see her daughter struggle on such an unsure path. Our Adelaide felt strongly that God was leading her to use her gifts and become who God called her to be. But, did she dare try?

The title, "*I Hope, I Am*" represents the hope we are consulting God for in our life's path. We pray those that saw the play will take this message of hope into the New Year and new decade. OUTREACH DEPARTMENT - 2019 YEAR IN REVIEW

Connections Ministry

The Connections Ministry is a weekly small, in-home group study of the Bible and Sunday sermons, fellowship, and prayer. We desire to connect the newest members of NBCF with smaller groups where they can discover their spiritual gifts and be launched into other ministries in the church. Currently there are active Connections groups in Kent, Auburn, Renton, Seattle Central District, University Place/Tacoma, Shoreline/North end, Fircrest/Tacoma, and NBCF Daytime/Senior.

Celebrate Recovery Ministry

This is a Christ centered ministry based on eight principles from what is commonly known as the Beatitudes of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. (Matt. 5:3-12). This ministry provides encouragement to help in those in their recovery journey and/or with their hurts, habits and hangups.

2019 Accomplishments

- Provided services to approximately 30 people
- The weekly meeting attendance ranged from eight to twelve persons
- Two of the ministry leaders attended the Celebrate Recovery summt in California for training. As a result of the training, the quality of the services provided by the ministry have expanded and improved
- Implemented the Angel Tree Campaign that provided Christmas gifts to children of incarcerated parents, which are given in the parent's name.

2020 Objectives

- Promote and advertise the Ministry so more people can benefit from what this ministry has to offer. Very few people know the ministry also addresses Hurts, Habits, and Hang-ups. Ministry leaders will attend the annual Celebrate Recovery Summit for continued training
- Implement the Angel Tree Campaign to provide Christmas gifts to children of incarcerated parents

Homeless Outreach Ministry

This Ministry provides meals, words of encouragement, and hope to homeless men and women.

2019 Accomplishments

- Provided approximately 1,200 dinners to homeless men and women in Renton
- Hosted an overnight men's shelter at NBCF in July
- Distributed 300 sack lunches to homeless men, women, and children in Kent and downtown Seattle
- Hosted a hot food cookout for the homeless in Renton
- •

2020 Objectives

- Provide 1,900 to 2,400 dinners to homeless in Renton
- Host an overnight men's shelter at NBCF in July
- Distribute sack lunches quarterly to the homeless in various communities
- Continue the annual hot food cookout for the homeless in Renton

Global Discipleship Ministry

This ministry was launched in September with the goal of providing monetary resources and words of encouragement to aid in freeing Haitian children from poverty.

2019 Accomplishments

- Partnered with Compassion International to bring the Compassion Experience weekend to the NBCF congregation.
- As a result of the Compassion Experience, the NBCF family released 60 children from poverty via new sponsorship commitments.
- NBCF sponsored 40 children and provided a check to Compassion International for \$18,230.
- Secured 40 individuals (Global Village Disciples) to serve as correspondents for the 40 children being sponsored by NBCF

2020 Objectives

- Host letter writing sessions for the NBCF Global Village Disciples, providing the tools needed to freely write to their children.
- Plan the 2020 Compassion Experience weekend.

Spotlight on an Awana Leader

Sister Vivian Grice has spent over ten years dedicating her time, talent and treasure helping to build a strong spiritual foundation in children at New Beginnings Christian Fellowship. She has ministered in the Early Childhood Center and Awana Club since their formation at NBCF.



She remains a dedicated, awesome Awana Leader to this day. Working full-time as an educator in the Seattle Public School District for twenty-one years she has touched the lives of hundreds of children.

We are thankful to Sister Vivian's daughter, Ali, for inviting this woman of God with a heart for children to New Beginnings. It is evident that Sister Vivian lives her faith and her belief in Proverbs 22:6, "Train up a child in the way they should go: and when they are old, they will not depart from it." Both Sister Vivian's daughters were Awana Clubbers When Jackie & Al Spears introduced Awana Club to NBCF. It was through their leadership that Sister Vivian answered the call to help clubbers memorize scripture and direct group sessions, working with the Sparks Club (Kindergarten through 2nd grade), which is the club she remains with today. She recalled how at the time our space was limited, to say the least. The unfinished gym had different types of floors and levels, a mixed-use space with stored items and ladders. But alas, space was carved out for the children and God's word was taught. Sparks often met in the halls; by the church office entrance or by the bathrooms. How time has changed!

What keeps Sister Vivian committed is her satisfaction and desire in seeing little ones develop and grow in love for The Lord. She emphasizes that with the condition of the world, now more than ever, we need to be able to call on the Name of The Lord. We need Him 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It is with sorrow she sees so many people who are ashamed when God The Father and His Precious Son, Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ's are glorified!

She believes children need to know their Creator and His Son, Jesus Christ who is "The Word" in John 1:1" In

the beginning was The Word and The Word was with God and The Word was God." John 1:14 "And The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us (and we beheld His Glory, the Glory as of the only begotten of The Father,) full of grace and truth." We must teach our children to pray, read His Word, and apply scripture in their daily lives. If they stray, they know they can call on the Name of The Lord to get back on the right path.

Over the years it has been a joy for Sister Vivian to see young children grow in their knowledge and relationship to Jesus. Watching them flourish is a blessing. She appreciates parent support and welcomes their love in sharing an evening or more to witness the testament of Jesus Christ in their little ones' lives!

Meeting prisoners' families where they are with the love of Christ, CR promotes Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree © program through CR chapters at churches and groups nationwide. Every Christmas, participating chapters deliver Angel Tree gifts and the Gospel message, creating pathways to heal and restore the bonds of incarcerated parents and their children.

Also know that CR joined forces with the Diaconate Charity Ministry and the Outreach Ministry to sponsor the Angel Tree, soliciting gifts for more than 90 children. Our members took to the task with enthusiasm giving the children quality gifts, and an abundance of toys, underwear, pajamas, and socks. The parents were overjoyed to be able to choose their child's gift, which also came with candy canes and hot apple cider.

Many of the stories we heard were heart wrenching. One young man received Avengers Legos and an Avengers charac-







ter. He excitedly screamed, "How did they know!" Another little one opened two of the five of his gifts and saved the others for Christmas. When he was told to read the card from his father, he asked if the card was really from his father. When he was told, "love you to the moon and back and hope to see you soon", was a direct quote from his father, he cried. His mother said he had been keeping his feelings bottled up for her sake, and seeing him so emotional, she vowed to take him to counselling with her. Another young lady could hardly believe it when she received a \$50 Claire's gift certificate and a backpack purse. The joy on her face was palpable.

For the volunteers, travelling to Centralia was a life altering experience, which was followed up with an event at New Beginnings for the Kent children.
